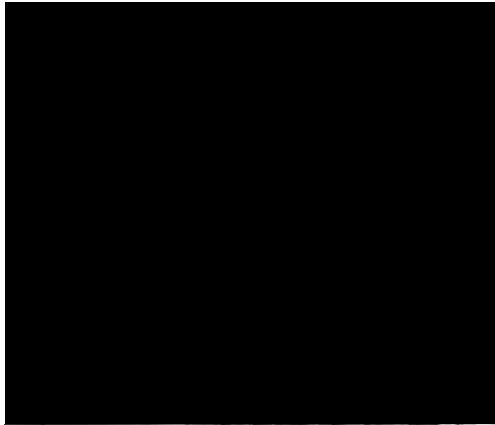




IN-PROGRESS PROJECTS



A.E. ENGLAND BUILDING (1926)

Located in downtown Phoenix, this building represents the oldest Phoenix structure to house an automotive dealership. The latest known tenant was the Phoenix Art Gallery. The original signature wood bow trusses have been completely restored. The renovated building will house a new public auditorium.



DINING HALL (1902)

This structure is the oldest of three historic buildings remaining within Steel Indian School Park in Phoenix, Arizona. Originally designed as an auditorium, it represents one of the most significant examples of Mission Revival style in the state.



GRAMMAR SCHOOL (1931)

Located within Steele Indian School Park, this building reflects the Second Renaissance Revival style. It originally housed a school's band and chorus.
